An Introduction from our Board of Trustees

SMBP works with students from low income backgrounds from across the UK, in Year 12 in England and Wales, Year 13 in Northern Ireland and S6 in Scotland, enabling access to work insight with multiple employers, resilience training and lifetime career mentoring.

Students attend a Work Insight and Skills week as part of a SMBP facilitated cluster, spending a day at four different businesses and a fifth day at a professional sports club where students learn about the psychology of resilience and goal achievement models, supported by our resilience partner Cleartrack Performance.

We pride ourselves on our lean approach to delivery; SMBP employs two full time members and one part time member of staff who in turn coordinate 700 plus volunteers within the participating businesses who deliver content on SMBP days or take responsibility for central functions under the direction of the SMBP team.

A huge thank you to our funders and volunteers without whom SMBP would not be possible. Whilst 2020 has been a challenging year, the SMBP students kept calm and carried on, enabling our most successful year to date.

A Message from the Team

Despite the added challenges Covid-19 brought with many SMBP volunteers being furloughed and some existing partners unable to support, SMBP increased its geographical reach in 2020 with the addition of the South Yorkshire Cluster, increased the number of corporate partners by 8% and maintained student attendance at 450.

In 2021, in line with an ongoing commitment to UK wide growth, SMBP will extend its reach by introducing Clusters in Cardiff, South Cambridgeshire, Rugby and the North East, as well as increasing student places in Belfast and London. Following the success of this years' virtual delivery model, SMBP will also introduce a virtual national week, accessible to students living in more rural areas of the UK and outside of our existing cluster regions.

The growth of SMBP to date is a result of collaboration. We work alongside businesses, sports clubs, charities and local councils, enabling each to play their part in the delivery of an SMBP Cluster. This report reflects on our collaborations in 2020 and features feedback from students and partners involved in 2020, a review of our programme delivery model and details of our End Digital Poverty Pilot which we hope to expand in 2021. 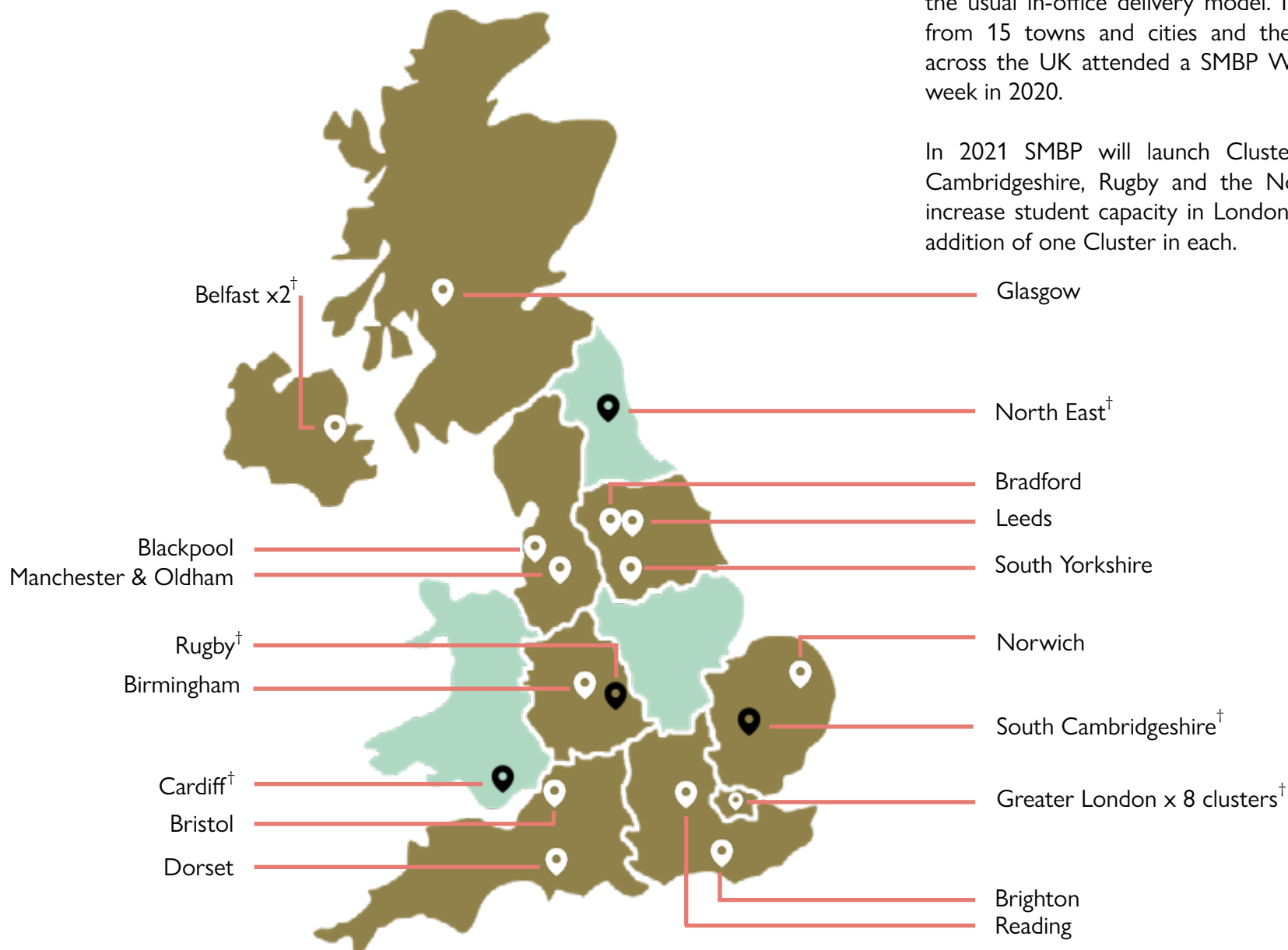

2020 Clusters and Beyond

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the SMBP team rapidly pivoted and worked with its partners to ensure an online programme was available to students as an alternative to the usual in-office delivery model. In total, 450 students from 15 towns and cities and their surrounding areas across the UK attended a SMBP Work Insight and Skills week in 2020.



In 2021 SMBP will launch Clusters in Cardiff, South Cambridgeshire, Rugby and the North East as well as increase student capacity in London and Belfast with the addition of one Cluster in each.

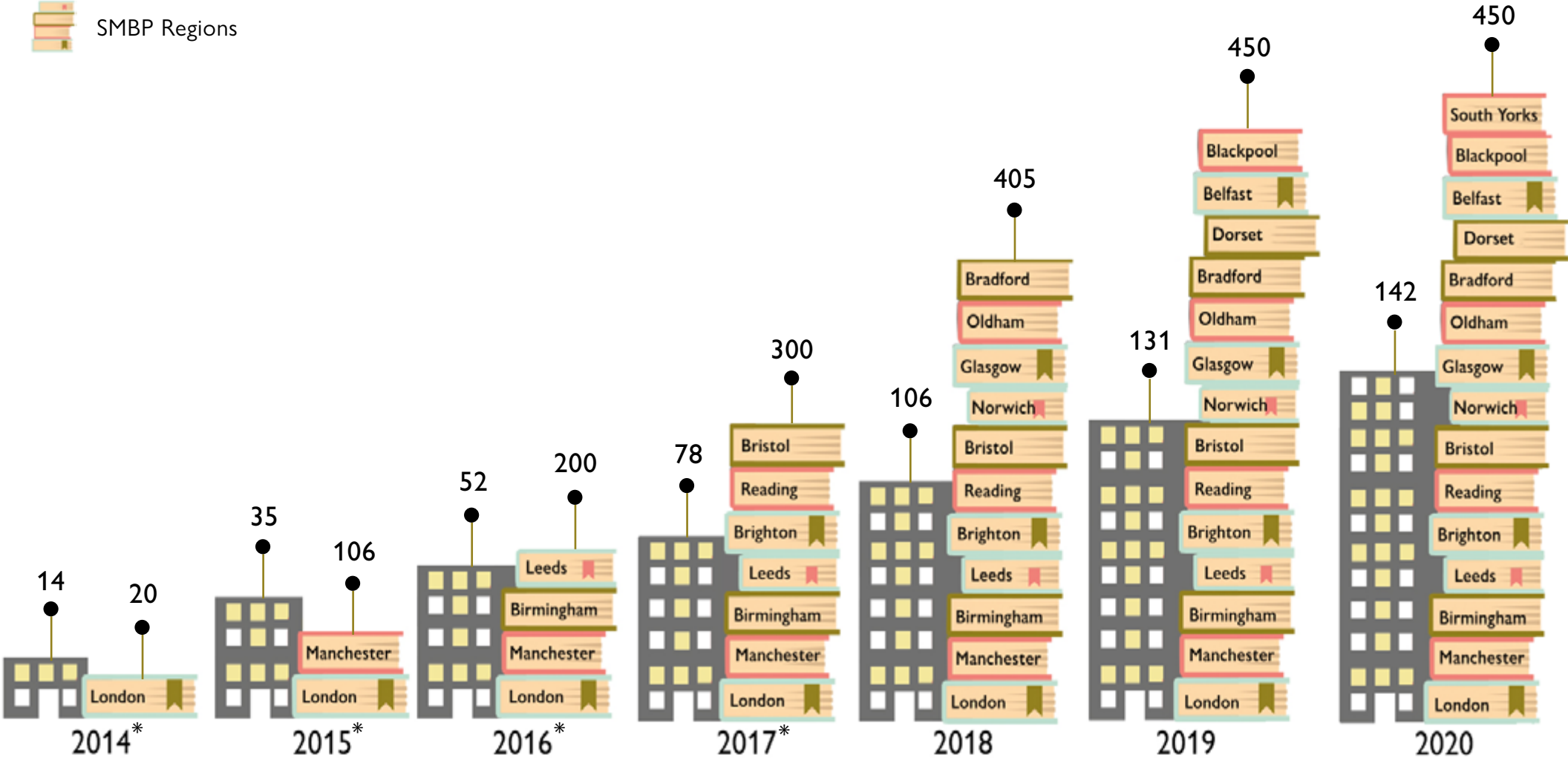

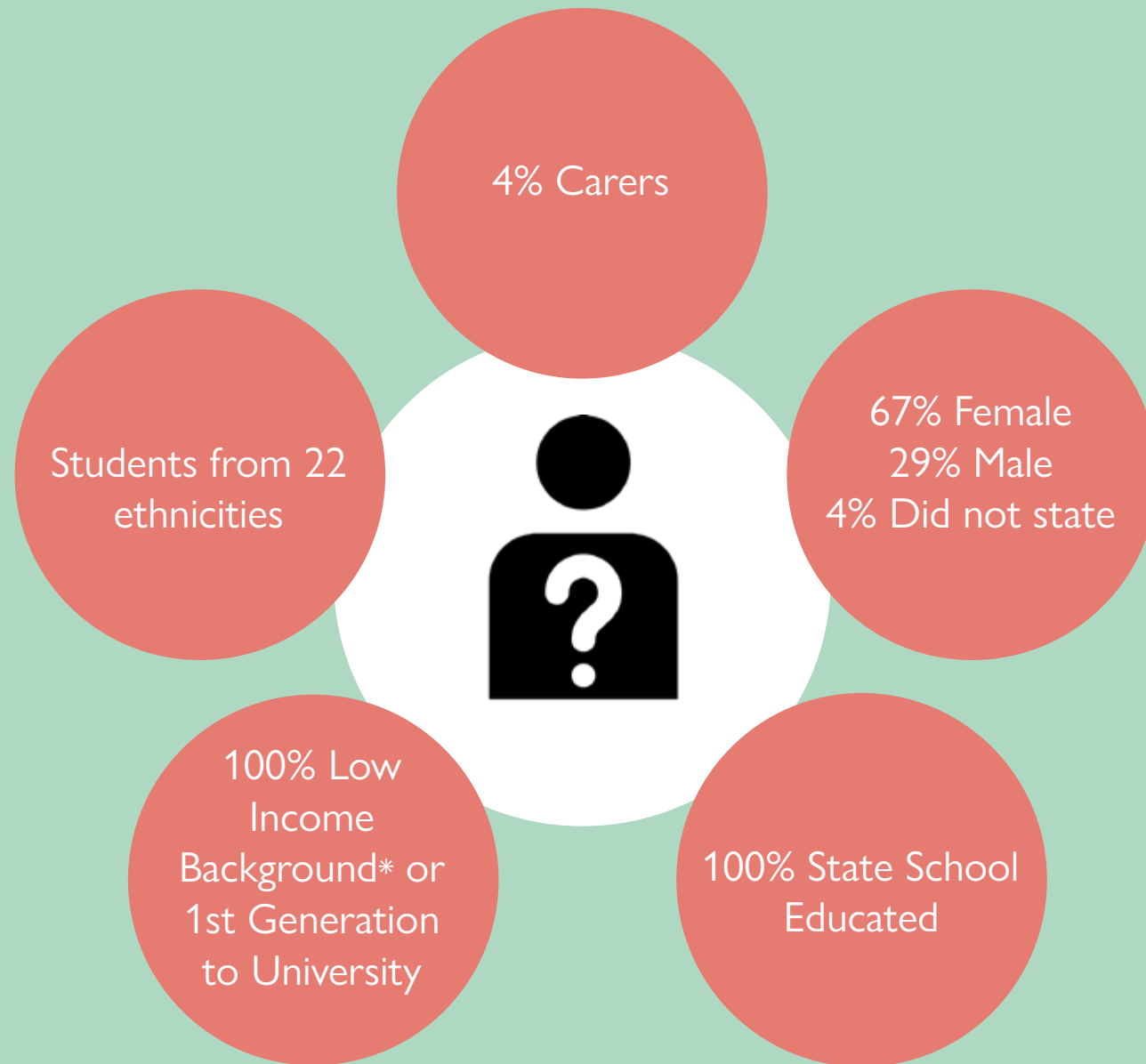

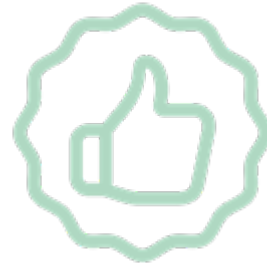

New Cluster Case Study - South Yorkshire

An Introduction

A huge shout out to South Yorkshire for showing true resilience in a year of adversity and going ahead with plans to launch a new Cluster!

SMBP were drawn to South Yorkshire Futures, a programme led by Sheffield Hallam University and backed by Department for Education, through a shared vision of improving social mobility in the South Yorkshire area. As part of SMBP's growth, we were looking to expand our reach across Yorkshire and following the great work SYF are doing, this collaboration seemed to be a perfect fit for SYF's 'Aspiration strand', which works to improve skills and increase employment among less advantaged young people.

Due to the pandemic, South Yorkshire was the only new Cluster to be created in 2020. It was not without facing some bumps in the road, such as onboarding new partners due to furloughed staff, but the SMBP team worked closely with the Cluster Head and Student Sourcing Lead, Liz and Bianca (South Yorkshire Futures) to ensure students were recruited and partners were equipped and supported for the week to run smoothly. New Cluster Case Study - South Yorkshire

A View From our Volunteer Cluster Head, South Yorkshire Futures

“[South Yorkshire Futures](#) – Sheffield Hallam University’s social mobility partnership – drives improvements in academic attainment and raises aspirations for young people in the region. Too often, young people’s careers are not based on what, but who they know. For students who do not have access to extensive networks, this can significantly limit their prospects, and, unfortunately, this tends to disproportionately impact young people from low income backgrounds.



South Yorkshire Futures were therefore determined to create opportunities for year 12 students across the South Yorkshire area and recruited 32 students for the Cluster.

Despite Covid-19 disrupting initial plans for the programme, the week kicked off with Bianca running the newly formed Induction Programme (created and donated to SMBP by Nicola Jones, Athena Professional) allowing students a warm welcome to the programme and helping them to develop an understanding of SMBP’s four key competencies (communication, teamwork and leadership, resilience and goal planning and creativity and problem solving) and why they matter. Following this, South Yorkshire partners delivered webinars across the week including: PlusNet, PwC, DWP and DfE and Sheffield Teaching Hospital (SYREC). This support from our employer-partners was not only a testament to the great employers in the region but an endorsement of the importance of social mobility programmes to engage and inspire the future workforce.

Although we all had to adapt to ensure the programme could be delivered virtually, we were delighted with the digital tools SMBP put in place. The Zoom platform, with options for breakout rooms and interactive polling, allowed meaningful interaction with students to take place in what could have been a very challenging environment.

Finally, the new Group Mentoring platform will be a great support to South Yorkshire students giving them access to several professionals from a wide variety of organisations. Students can log into the portal at any time and put in a request for support from a mentor volunteer to assist them with their CV, personal statement, university or apprenticeship application forms and for help and advice on interviews.

It is great to know there is real sustainability for our young people on the programme, and the option for this support to continue long into their careers should they need it.”

SMBP End Digital Poverty Collaboration Pilot

Building on SMBP's founding principle of change through collaboration, we spearheaded an innovative 'end digital poverty' pilot project in the summer of 2020. The pilot was designed to:

- complement our pivot to full online delivery in response to the pandemic in 2020; and
- stress test a collaboration model which could enable all UK businesses to contribute to the provision of devices, data and, equally importantly, technology help desk support to individuals from low income backgrounds.

The Pilot Partners



The Pilot Model

The model piggybacked on the existing commercial relationship between a business and their mobile network operator.

Meggitt PLC donated a proportion of their Vodafone 'device try before you buy' tech fund and a 4G SIM to SMBP students in need.

The devices and data were provided to SMBP students using the same model for new Meggitt employees hence not triggering the need to identify a standalone budget or create new process.

The devices were then set up with the SMBP App and distributed on a pro bono basis by Vodafone to the SMBP students. The devices were also protected, at the set up phase, by software donated by MobileIron; the software restricted access to harmful content and enabled remote lockdown and wiping of the device if stolen.

SMBP, Meggitt and Vodafone agreed a model to provide first and second line tech support to deal with any issues the students had with the hardware, software or connectivity.

PTI, together with N2S, were tasked with assessing the future scalability of the model through the utilisation of refurbished devices and the creation of a virtual helpdesk platform to enable a 'hub and spoke' collaboration between SMBP businesses. Following on from this assessment, SMBP and [Red Badger's Mission Beyond project](#) are currently in discussions with IBM to make this a reality!

SMBP End Digital Poverty Collaboration Pilot

Resilience & Goal Planning Review

"I attended the SMBP programme in 2016, it was a priceless experience in my quest to understand the business world and how legal advisors worked within it. Since then, I have graduated from SOAS University of London with a Law degree, completed my Legal Practice Course at the University of Law and will be starting my Solicitor training contract at Hogan Lovells in 2022. Throughout my career journey the experiences through SMBP have been a point I could focus on in applications and interviews; it has underpinned the personal growth and development, the passion and awareness for commercial law that I developed.

During the SMBP Work Insight and Skills week I attended 4 business days and the London Cluster Resilience and Goal Planning day, then hosted by the Harlequins FC Foundation. Resilience has been a key part of my journey to date and something I have regularly applied when experiencing my own setbacks.

Developed by Cleartrack Performance (led by ex-professional athlete, Mark Soden) and validated by Headmaster and child psychologist Dr Trevor Richards, the resilience day is a key feature of all SMBP weeks across the UK. The Cleartrack Performance team run a Train the Trainer session in London with our delivery partners, some of the biggest names in UK sport including Manchester United, Ulster Rugby, Wasps and Southampton FC. They then support the delivery of the course on a voluntary basis across the UK to ensure consistency in each Cluster.

The course consists of 5 modules which focus on practical steps we all can take to manage & insulate ourselves from pressure and deal with setbacks. These steps have their foundation in the world of professional sport but apply equally to navigating a career journey. In 2020 the course was developed into a supported learning app including guided Cleartrack seminars featuring the likes of Martin Lewis OBE, Sir Lenny Henry and Dame Heather Rabbatts, quizzes and reflection points. The key takeouts are reiterated further by videos from professional athletes such as England rugby player Kyle Sinckler and British athlete Morgan Lake. We will return to physical delivery at our professional sport club partners next year (including, new for 2021, Arsenal FC) but the app will augment our delivery model going forward to enable continuous learning beyond the SMBP Resilience and Goal Planning day experience.

Following my resilience training with Cleartrack Performance in 2019 I am now a volunteer delivery lead for SMBP allowing me to pass on my knowledge to students. I am looking forward to delivering more resilience days in 2021 as we reintroduce our face-to-face days."

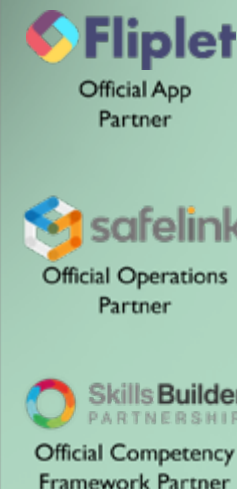
The small (2.5 FTE) but perfectly formed SMBP team broker relationships with student sourcing partners, provide all materials required for the onboarding of students, train mentors and SMBP resilience day delivery leads and organise & pay for all student travel. This enables businesses to focus on the planning of their day and limits the cost of participating to the cost of sandwiches at lunchtime! With such a small team, SMBP has always embraced operational efficiency practices usually associated with a FTSE 100; not surprising given the team are former commercial colleagues from ITV! This year was no exception:

- SMBP introduced Safelink, a secure platform for sharing sensitive documents and data. Each regional cluster of partners now has access to a data room where all the materials and templates they need are stored and any documents they need to share can be uploaded. It has vastly reduced email volume and overcame the challenge of sending multiple attachments over email with password protection. Huge thanks to Safelink for their generous donation!
- A full review of the SMBP Competency Framework was completed this year in partnership with Skills Builder (www.skillsbuilder.org). At the end of each work insight day students were prompted to log their experiences by reference to the competencies. By the end of the week each student had a range of competency based anecdotes to include in their personal statement and refer to in interviews.
- Last but not least for this year saw the launch of the SMBP Student App. The SMBP team worked with Fliplet to design and develop an app to support student registration, programme delivery and continue to support the students after the SMBP week. The app was key to this year's virtual delivery providing students with access to the live webinars, pre reading and reminders a webinar was starting via push notifications. Huge thanks to Mike Gallop and the team at Fliplet for the generous donation of the software and developer time and our very own volunteer CTO, Annette Brown from Milbank LLP, for bringing the project to life!

I'm really proud to be a member of the volunteer senior leadership team at SMBP and look forward to supporting SMBP's continued growth and evolution in 2021 and beyond!"

“SMBP was an invaluable experience in my journey to securing a training contract with Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer in 2018. As well as having fantastic names such as ITV and Aston Martin on my CV, the skills and support gained along the way prepared me for assessment centres and beyond!

I now volunteer for SMBP overseeing our student sourcing arrangements to enable more students like me to experience an SMBP Work Insight and Skills Week and receive lifelong career coaching through our Group Mentoring offer.

In 2020, SMBP launched a new Group Mentoring platform powered by MentorXchange to support the ever-growing user base of SMBP alumni students. The platform, backed by developers H Farm, has streamlined the onboarding process of both students and mentors whilst strengthening the already high level of safeguarding SMBP delivers.

2020 has also witnessed a bolstering of our support to mentors through the provision of virtual training to compliment the SMBP Group Mentoring Guide, designed by Silverloop; a document created by HR teams from our partners working in collaboration to produce a bible of what good looks like in terms of CVs, Personal Statements, answers to competency questions regularly asked in application forms and interviews. The Guide provides model answers to example questions that could be asked by SMBP alumni to ensure volunteer mentors are confident in providing them with advice.

The Group Mentoring model (alumni are mentored by the group rather than one individual) pioneered by SMBP means that volunteer mentors can regulate their input to accommodate fluctuating work and life commitments; it also enables scaling of the geographic reach of SMBP because we are not dependent on recruiting individual mentors to map against student numbers in each geography we expand into.

I'm looking forward to 2021 when we can get back into our partner workplaces and expand to Cardiff, Rugby, South Cambridgeshire and the North East and increase places in our existing Clusters!”



Joshua Patterson, Class of 2016

I took part in the LSMP, now SMBP, in 2016. I had no real experience of the corporate world and certainly none in the corporate law sphere. I had no prior knowledge of what corporate solicitors did nor any knowledge of how to become a corporate solicitor. The LSMP fuelled my ambition to pursue a career in City law and equipped me with preliminary tools to achieve this. I was able to understand what City solicitors did and the process of going through Vacation Schemes and Training Contract applications.

During my A-levels, I was a carer for my father and missed a significant amount of time at sixth form and on independent study. I subsequently underperformed in my finals and did not make it into a Russell Group university. At this point, I contemplated giving up my hope to become a corporate solicitor. I reached out to several contacts that I made during the LSMP that motivated me to carry on with my legal education and pursue my career aspirations.

During university, I was able to secure places on various City law firm schemes, and my experience from the LSMP was invaluable in helping to attain these. Knowing how a law firm operates as a business was key to securing places on the schemes, and that is what the LSMP taught me and formed the basis for many of my interview questions. I also believe that having the LSMP experience on my CV put me in a much better position compared to the many other applicants.

The resilience and perseverance that was partly instilled through the LSMP paid off as I was offered a Training Contract at City law firm Bryan Cave Leighton Paisner in 2020, to commence in 2022. I would actively encourage any student to firmly grasp the opportunity to take part in the SMBP scheme as I know it paid huge dividends in my journey.

LSMP (AKA SMBP) is an experience I will always find myself referring to in interviews. Early on within my career, securing such an incredible experience has undoubtedly been one of the most significant incentives. This programme stops you from even thinking of your limits, simply because the amount of support, guidance, and skills you obtain are enough to excel you beyond what you once considered to be your limits.

Before partaking in the SMBP, I always knew that the legal career was where my gut instinct leads me, and I only really began to comprehend and understand the way forward post the SMBP. The week consisted of working alongside high-profile in-house and private legal teams, including American Express, Denton's, and ITV. A specific task I benefitted from at American Express was solving a real-life legal scenario with a group of peers, which required creative problem-solving. I am now able to use my initiative to think and interpret legal context through inductive reasoning critically.

The SMBP proved to be an experience valued by employers when in 2018, I was put through a rigorous selection process for an internship with Bank of America Merrill Lynch. I recollect how the interview panel was rather keen to be enlightened further about my valuable time working with whom were known to them as clients.

Establishing strong interpersonal skills such as oral communication and negotiation skills has equipped me for my Law path. I am lucky enough to have been selected for this brilliant opportunity. As daunting as it sounds, the way employers think has altered over generations. You will need more than just top marks and a determined look on your face to land yourself a job today. It is no longer right to think of a training contract or even a vacation scheme as the first stage in your career. The first stage should be gaining some relevant substantive work experience, and I encourage all individuals not to let such opportunities pass by.
