SACRE RE Subject Knowledge Enhancement Programme 2019-2020 (Westhill Grant Funded)



This is what the latest Ofsted Inspection Handbook has to say about subject knowledge:

- 181. Teachers have expert knowledge of the subjects that they teach. If they do not, they are supported to address gaps in their knowledge so that pupils are not disadvantaged by ineffective teaching.
- 187. Discussions with subject specialists and leaders about the content and pedagogical content knowledge of teachers, and what is done to support them

Implementation

From 'Good' Descriptor for Quality of education:

- Teachers have good knowledge of the subject(s) and courses they teach. Leaders provide effective support for those teaching outside their main areas of expertise.
- Teachers present subject matter clearly, promoting appropriate discussion about the subject matter being taught. They check pupils' understanding systematically, identify misconceptions accurately and provide clear, direct feedback. In so doing, they respond and adapt their teaching as necessary without unnecessarily elaborate or individualised approaches.

Format of the RE Subject Knowledge Sessions:

- Each session to be held in a place of worship
- Tour of place of worship with key features and links to practices pointed out
- Talk by relevant SACRE member to give a basic overview of the faith
- Q&A session (we will try to anticipate some of the questions that might be asked)
- Filming by a professional filmographer so that the tour and Q&A can be used back in school for staff meetings and CPD (as 2 x 20 minute film clips)
- 'Road Map' suggesting approaches and resources to be used back in school for teaching that tradition/worldview



New 2 RE Course for NQTs

New2RE Programme for Newly Qualified teachers of Religious Education in Secondary Schools

The National Association of Teachers of Religious Education (NATRE) has been funded to provide a three year programme of support for RE NQTs. The programme recognises that the teaching of RE requires rapid development of subject specific knowledge and pedagogy and that support for this is not always readily available. By providing a tailored programme to support the NQT that will complement a school's own programme New2RE has been successful in improving the retention rate of NQTs in RE over the last five years. The benefits of the programme are worth £1000 per year and include NATRE membership, a specialist mentor, a 30 hour residential course, free courses and webinars and printed resources.



Coventry and Warwickshire Children's Peace Poem 2020

Lord Mayor's Peace Committee for Peace and Reconciliation, Coventry Cathedral, SACRE and the United Nations Association Coventry Branch invite Coventry children to write a poem on the theme of Human Rights.

We want to celebrate Coventry's global place as a City of Peace and Reconciliation, welcoming people of all cultures from all over the world.

But peace is much more than just the absence of war. People cannot live in peace if they are deprived of their fundamental human rights.

We think children need to know more about what human rights are. That is why we have chosen Human Rights as the theme for Coventry Children's Peace Poem 2020.

As Article 26.2 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights states:

"Education shall be directed to the full development of the human personality and to the strengthening of respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms. It shall promote understanding, tolerance and friendship among all nations, racial or religious groups, and shall further the activities of the United Nations for the maintenance of peace."

The Prizes

The winning poems will be selected by a panel of judges. The results will be announced in January 2020. The authors of the best three poems will

- Meet Lord Mayor of Coventry or Chair of Warwickshire County Council
- Receive a Winners Certificate
- Read their poem at an award ceremony in January


