Teacher Training/CPD programme

We now offer free online teacher training opportunities to support primary and secondary teachers at all stages in their careers, including those currently undertaking teacher training programmes. 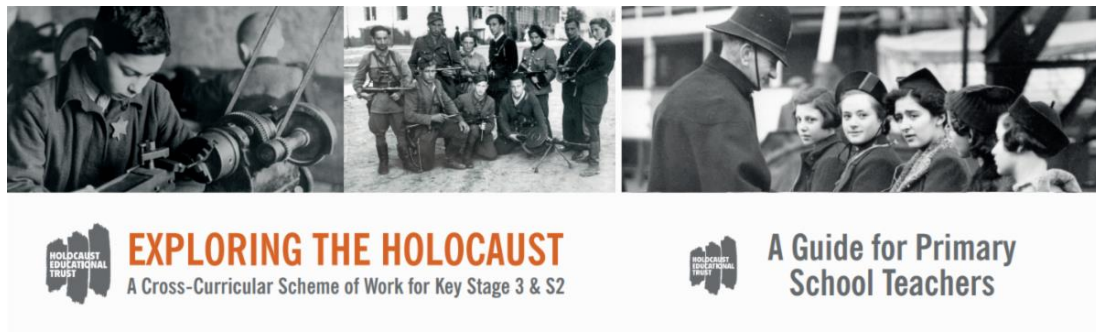

Educational resources

The Trust's website provides free, downloadable lesson plans, classroom resources and guidance documents for teachers.

- Our flagship resource is [Exploring the Holocaust](#), a free, comprehensive and flexible cross-curricular scheme of work for the teaching of the Holocaust at Key Stage 3 in England, Wales and Northern Ireland and at S2 in Scotland.
- It contains 15 downloadable lesson plans with accompanying resources for use in History, Religious Education or Philosophy, and Citizenship or PSHE, together with guidance documents for [English](#), [Art](#) and [Drama](#).
- We also offer a wide range of resources for other age groups, including a series of lessons for use in [primary schools](#).

Outreach Programme

We are now working directly with schools to coordinate live online Holocaust survivor testimony with schools and students across the UK. These sessions are delivered over video call platforms including Zoom, Google Meets or Teams, for the academic year 2020-2021.

- Online survivor testimony sessions are open to classes from year 6 upwards.
- Each video call is facilitated by a member of the Trust's team.
- Online sessions take place at the following times each week:
 - Tuesday 11.00
 - Wednesday 14.00
 - Friday 10.30
- Sessions last approximately 1 hour 30 minutes including time for the survivor testimony and time for students to ask questions.
