



A creative response to climate change

Competition Rules

- 1. Every pupil between years 5 and 13, in a school or college in Warwick District, or home-schooled and resident in Warwick District, can enter the competition.
- 2. There are four age groups, defined by school year:

Group 1: Years 5 and 6 Group 3: Years 9 and 10 Group 2: Years 7 and 8 Group 4: Years 11, 12 and 13

In each age group we will award an individual first prize or prizes of £100 and two second prizes of £50. We will also award a prize of £1000 to the school submitting the best body of work.

- 3. To enter, e-mail up to three photographs of your entry, or a pdf if it is in words rather than images, to info@WarwickshireClimateAlliance.org.uk. Please change the filename of each photo so that it incorporates your name, year and school (e.g. "JaneJonesYr9GrangeHill.jpg" rather than "273569.jpg"). The entries will be displayed on the Warwickshire Open Studios website.
- 4. Visual arts entries will be short-listed on the basis of the photo; if your entry is short-listed we will contact you and ask you to bring the entry itself, not a photo, to an exhibition (venue to be arranged), where the final judging will take place.
- 5. The deadline for submitting entries is Saturday 3rd of April 2021, and the results of the competition will be released in June 2021. The judges' decision will be final.
- 6. Participants retain copyright of their images, but agree to allow Warwickshire Open Studios and Warwickshire Climate Alliance to display them on their website and in future promotional material.
